

Operation Lifesaver turns 50

In 1972, the Idaho State Highway Patrol and the Union Pacific Railroad mounted a campaign to promote "Stop, Look and Listen" safety at highway-rail grade crossings. Idaho experi-enced a 43% reduction in fatalities that first year. 50 years later, OLI has authorized volunteer speakers and trained instructors who provide free rail safety education programs across the U.S. and abroad. We give presentations to school groups, driver education classes, community members, professional drivers, law enforcement officers, and emergency responders. The programs are co-sponsored by federal, state and local government agencies, highway safety organizations and America's railroad systems.

Patrick Barnes (CSX) and his team attended our January ZOOM meeting and gave a fascinating presentation about new technologies developed at CSX using GIS, robotics, and drones,

In February Bob Ledoux told us about Florida East Coast Railway—from the early days when Henry Flagler purchased the Railroad (1883) and helped to develop the eastern coast Florida to their many innovations (first to operate 2-person crews, development of the first end of train device, concrete ties across the railroad, the use of LNG fuel to name a few.) FEC is able to serve 70% of the US market in 4 days or less.

In March we met in person at a local Thai restaurant (and had members on ZOOM as well.) No speakers at this meeting since we were selecting delegates, alternates, Woman of the Year (Nancy Von Dolteren) and our Trailblazer (Lora Dorman) for Founders Day.

The ladies of Pittsburgh Chapter are doing well. The ladies met in December, and have another in-person meeting scheduled for March 27th.




