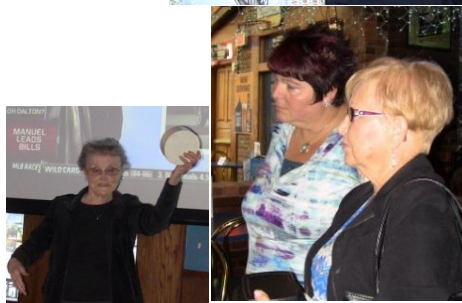
INDIANAPOLIS CHARTER CHAPTER

The Chapter's September meeting was held at the Slippery Noodle Inn with a tour of the historic building. Following are photos taken at the meeting:

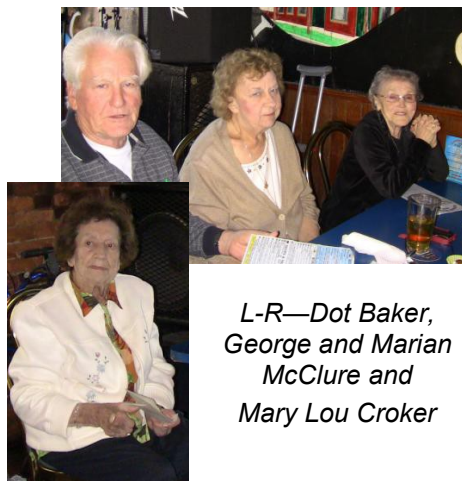

Rozan Prizmich passed away May 4, 2012 in Roseville, Calif. She was a loving mother, grandmother and friend to many in Roseville throughout her life. Rozan was born January 31, 1929 in Roseville and graduated from Roseville High School. Upon graduation from high school, she began working for the Southern Pacific (SP) Railroad. During her 45 year railroad career, she worked as a trainmaster's clerk and secretary for the Roseville Plant Manager. In 1970, Rozan became active in the Sacramento chapter of the National Association of Railway Business Women (NARBW) where she was twice elected chapter president. She later held various national NARBW offices including national president of the 4,000 member association. Rozan was the first to be elected from the West Coast and the first SP employee to hold this top office. She

was also a member of the National Association of Retired and Veteran Railway Employees (NARVRE). She loved traveling and enjoyed spending summers in Lake Tahoe with her family in the home built by her husband, Tony. Rozan is going to be greatly missed by her family and friends. She is survived by her two daughters, Kerry Prizmich from Vacaville, and Suzan Donald (Steve) from Shingle Springs; and her granddaughter, Lindsay Loder (Ron) from Carmichael. Rozan was preceded in death by her loving husband of 61 years, Tony.
