

### Public Affairs

**TAX INFO:** At a recent visit with our tax guy, he mentioned that when the IRS extends the filing deadline for **Federal** taxes, that does NOT change the filing deadline for your **State** taxes. Last year the IRS extended the deadline until July 15. Many assumed that would apply to the **State** tax, which ended up creating penalties that were assessed for late filing. Currently, the deadline for filing **Federal** taxes is May 17 (per 3/18/21 *The Roanoke Times*). The Federal date could still be changed again but, keep in mind the **State** tax is due April 15.

**GOOD NEWS FOR AMTRAK:** With the passage of the COVID relief bill, Amtrak announced it will restore 12 long-distance routes to daily service between May 24<sup>th</sup> and June 7. Trains originating in New York return June 7 with service to New Orleans, Savannah and Miami.

**RRB IMPROVES TOLL-FREE SERVICE:** The RRB developed two changes in their nationwide toll-free telephone system. To address lengthy wait times for callers on their toll-free number – 877-772-5772 – the RRB added a virtual hold function and increased their hours of availability. Effective February 15, rather than staying on the phone until a representative is available, callers will be able to request a call back when their place in line comes up. When choosing this option callers will be asked to confirm their phone numbers and record their name.

The system will then tell them approximately how long it will take for them to receive a call back. At the time the return call is placed, the person answering the phone will be able to accept the call, request a brief delay while the original caller comes to the phone, or reschedule the call for a later time.

Additionally the RRB has extended its hours which claims representatives will be available to answer calls. The hours during which the toll-free number will accept calls will be from 9 AM to 3 PM each business day, Monday thru Friday. You can also visit RRB.gov.
